



## 2014 Walla Walla Valley Syrah

At the northern tip of the Rhone Valley lies Cote-Rotie, where the practice of co-fermenting small amounts of Viognier with Syrah began. Elegant and floral, the nose promises bright acidity and red fruit, strawberry and raspberry. The body delivers on the promise, and backs it with red meat and black pepper. Deftly balanced, with hints of cedar, vanilla and cherry drifting through the lengthy finish.
